Another busy and exciting week at Sacred Heart School where learning is fun!




Reception have been busy learning about different instruments and the sounds they make. We enjoyed making different sounds, hiding sounds around the room and moving to different types of music.

Today I got him back! I got that scrawny highwayman back! Bess won't love him anymore...


