PARENT FUNDRAISING CHALLENGE

For those of you who don't know the Sanday family, a short introduction: Oliver, the youngest of three boys, is in his final year at Sacred Heart so 2018 concludes a long association for the family with the school – some 11 or 12 years. During that time Mr Sanday has served as Parent Governor and Mrs Sanday was PTA Secretary during a particularly vibrant chapter of fundraising. They have always been firm supporters of the school and we would like to share with you news of Mrs Sanday's extraordinary efforts to raise awareness and funds for research into colon cancer, also known as bowel cancer or colorectal cancer.

In early February I join a group taking on a winter summit of Mount Toubkal in the High Atlas Range, Northern Africa's highest mountain!

The aim is to help raise awareness of colon cancer and funds for 40tude, a charity I feel privileged to help run. One of my oldest friends lost her father to colon cancer all too early, and I'd like to help prevent any more families suffering this heartbreak in the near future. Colon cancer is the second most common cancer in the UK, however it is one of the easiest cancers to treat if detected early. As well as raising awareness of this very preventable disease, 40tude curing colon cancer raises funds to support leading-edge research projects which otherwise struggle to get funding. We're working to raise awareness of the importance of getting screened regularly from your mid-40s, and making high-quality CT colonography screening more widely available across the UK.

We will be walking in the wind and on snow, using crampons and ice axes to steady ourselves, to the summit of Toubkal at 4,167 metres. I think it will be quite a challenge, especially walking at the high altitude, but knowing I am helping to raise vital funds will definitely inspire my little legs to keep going when the going gets tough (without my ever-cheerful dog)!
