Three children played in the recent Southern Gigafinal. This is the area round of the nationwide UK Chess Challenge where 40,000 children play and by the Gigafinals only 2000 are left. As a result, 2 points out of 6 rounds is definitely a good score. All the children scored more than this with Oliver (Y4) scoring 4 points (and qualifying for the Challengers Tournament) in the U9 boys; Elena (Y5) (having a rare off day) scoring 3 points in the U10 girls and Dean (Y2) scoring 2.5 points in the U7 boys. A special mention for Dean who had to cope with using a chess clock for the first time. Congratulations to them all!
