
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Another busy and exciting week at Sacred Heart School where learning is fun!

On 26th June KS1 and FS went to Wilderness Wood. We travelled on a coach and I played lots of hand shake games with my partner. After that we collected interesting bits and bobs as clues to see what animals might live in the woods. I enjoyed picking up clues to make a nest like sticks, berries, pinecones and chestnuts. Finally, we made wild things out of clay, sticks and leaves. It was really fun.

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Year 5

On Tuesday 26th June Year 5 were invited to a STEM workshop at Mayfield School. The theme was Magic and Wizardry and the children took part in four different activities. The first was examining owl pellets and the cross-checking against a table to identify what the owl had been eating - a little unsavoury perhaps but very interesting! After this there was an ICT session where all the children learnt how to develop their own web page about owls. Although this was complicated, everyone managed to do this in record time!



After lunch we examined exponential growth patterns in Maths, and all the children were declared expert Mathematicians! The final session was very exciting. Children had to work out how to propel marbles along a meter length of string suspended across the classroom. They were given a balloon, some card and sellotape and had to work out a method for themselves. All of them were successful and there was fierce competition for the prizes at the end of the session. Both sessions were hugely enjoyable and have demonstrated how much fun Science can be!



Y5 & Y6 Trip to Wakehurst Place

This week Years 5 and 6 visited Wakehurst Place. All the children had learnt about reproduction in plants during Science lessons and the visit was a hands-on opportunity to consolidate this learning. They started out with a workshop examining the structure of flowers and then dissecting and labelling each part. There was a seed and flower trail where children investigated different pollinators and clues to indicate how grasses and flowers are pollinated. They finished the day with a seed workshop where they investigated seeds under the microscope and looked at methods of seed dispersal.
